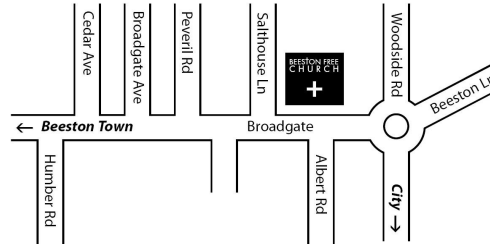

**Place:** Beeston Free Church



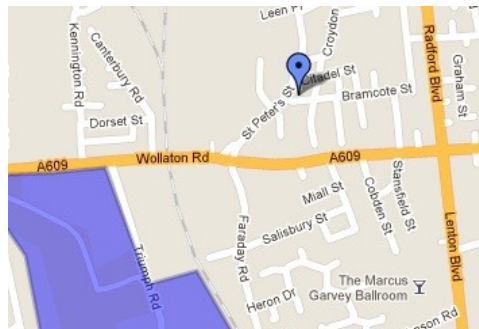
